

NOTICE REGARDING MAINTENANCE COVERS IN DEWEY SQUARE

Veolia Environnement S.A., is a world leader in privatizing and extracting capital from water, transport, waste management and energy services traditionally managed by public authorities. By reducing total services and expenditures compared to public authorities, Veolia remains a world leader in enriching its shareholders at public expense. Residents of Milwaukee, Beijing, Jerusalem, Los Angeles, New Orleans, Boston, and other cities agree.

Veolia's maintenance covers in Dewey square are part of a network supplying thermal energy to 44 million square feet of space in the city of Boston. Steam generating capacity of 1.6 million pounds per hour produces thermal energy, which is delivered through a 17-mile distribution pipe network controlled with advanced systems. Approximately 50% of the steam supplied to the Boston network is "green" cogenerated steam that is imported from Cambridge.

Veolia Transport is helping to build and operate a tramway linking settlements in East Jerusalem with Israel. These settlements contravene article 49 of the 4th Geneva Convention forbidding an occupier transferring its own civilians into the territory it occupies. In most cases the establishment of the Israeli settlements involved war crimes as well. The tramway tightens Israel's hold on occupied East Jerusalem, ties the settlements more firmly into Israel and undermines chances of a just peace for the Palestinian people.

Veolia is a world leader in assisting an illegal occupation and advancing a future in which basic human requirements are owned as property and sold as commodity. Fortunately, Veolia is unable to assist *this* particular occupation by allowing its participants to extract heat from its highly advanced "green" cogenerated steam network.
